AFFORDING GOING ABROAD

IMPORTANT THINGS TO CONSIDER



Academic Planning

The importance of getting an early start on planning your study abroad experience is essential. Working with your academic advisor to discuss the courses you can take while studying abroad will help ensure the credits you earn will count toward your degree.



Semester vs. Short-Term Study Abroad vs. Internships

You may think a full semester abroad will automatically be more expensive than a summer option, because of the program length and corresponding fee. However, financial aid and loans are more readily available to you during the academic year. Semester study abroad programs also allow you to work during the summer and save toward your travel costs. If you plan well, your semester abroad can replace a semester on your home campus. The courses you take, whether they are courses in your major, general degree requirements, or electives, should keep you on track to graduate on time.

On the other hand, short-term study abroad, whether it is a summer, January, or inter-term program, may present a better opportunity for you. Your major may make it difficult to stay on track to graduate on time if you try to study abroad for a full semester. A short-term program may also offer a specific academic focus that directly supports your major. These opportunities cost less than semester-long study abroad, simply by virtue of their shorter duration. With many calendar options available, you may also be able to find an inter-term opportunity that will still allow you to work during the summer.

There is also the internship abroad which costs less than most study abroad programs and is offered during the semester or summer. Although the internship is unpaid, we recommend contacting your home campus to see if you can receive academic credit for your work experience or financial aid and loans.

The most important decision is that you go abroad. Regardless of your program's length, your experience abroad will set you apart from the crowd. Only a fraction of U.S. college students go abroad for academic credit. Be sure that you're one of them!



Home School Tuition and Fees

As you look at different program options abroad and costs, consider what you are currently paying at your home institution. If you attend a private college or are an out-of-state student at a public university, you may be paying considerably more per semester than you would pay for a semester-long study abroad or internship abroad program.

If you are an in-state student at a public institution, the cost of a program abroad is comparable in many cases, after you consider tuition and fees, housing, meals and other expenses. Consider commuting costs, along with the out-of-pocket personal expenses that you incur while attending your home institution, and any gap that exists shrinks further.



Federal Financial Aid and Loans

If you are eligible for Federal Financial Aid and/or loans, these funds should be yours to use on your study abroad or internship abroad program. If the academic credit you will earn abroad is approved by your home institution, then your financial aid is available to you. AIFS will work together with you and your study abroad and financial aid offices to help facilitate the use of these funds.



Home Institution or Private Source Grants and Scholarships

Scholarships or grants that you receive from your home institution may be available to you to use on a program abroad. However, oftentimes these funds are only available if you participate on a program run by your home institution. You should discuss the availability of institutional aid with your financial aid and study abroad offices. Grants or scholarships that you receive from sources other than your home school can often be used for study abroad. Check with the source of those funds to inquire about eligibility.



SCHOLARSHIPS

SIR CYRIL TAYLOR LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

✓ Eligibility 3.0 GPA

\$ Per student \$1,000 semester/\$500 summer and January term

This scholarship is awarded each term in honor of AIFS' founder, Sir Cyril Taylor. AIFS offers semester, summer and January term scholarships to students who demonstrate high academic achievements and articulate their objectives in a required essay.

GENERATION STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIPS

✓ Eligibility 3.0 GPA

\$ Per student \$1,000 semester/\$500 summer or January term programs

In support of the Institute of International Education's Initiative, AIFS offers semester, summer and January term scholarships to students who demonstrate high academic achievement and articulate their academic objectives in a required essay.



RUSSEL R. TAYLOR FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

✓ Eligibility	3.5 GPA and financial need
\$ Per student	50% of program fee

The Russel R. Taylor Foundation is committed to providing study abroad scholarships for students who have demonstrated academic excellence and who have significant financial need. Scholarships covering up to half the program fee are available each semester and summer. To apply students must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5. Students should apply by the published deadlines prior to their semester of choice, providing an essay stating their academic objectives together with supporting documentation of financial need. (Pell Grant eligible students will be given priority).

AIFS DIVERSITY ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

✓ Eligibility	3.00 GPA/minority and other under-represented students
\$ Per student	\$5,000 (fall or spring semester)

AIFS is proud to offer special scholarships for high achieving students from backgrounds historically underrepresented in education abroad. Each semester, AIFS offers up to three \$5,000 scholarships to applicants who demonstrate high academic achievement and/or participate in community service activities.



AIFS OVERSEAS AMBASSADOR SCHOLARSHIP

✓ Eligibility	3.00 GPA/minority and other under-represented students
\$ Per student	\$500 (semester or summer)

AIFS is pleased to offer five \$500 scholarships each semester and two \$500 scholarships for summer programs to outstanding students from backgrounds historically underrepresented in study abroad. Students from the following backgrounds are strongly encouraged to apply: Economically disadvantaged, ethnically & racially diverse, first-generation, LGBTQIA+, students with disabilities, students of faith, veterans, and adult students.

Applicants must be willing to share their experiences abroad via blogs, pictures, and video (at least once a week) on social media and provide a testimonial at the end of their program. These materials will be shared on the AIFS social media channels and blog site. AIFS Overseas Ambassadors serve in the role for the duration of their chosen study abroad program which can range from two weeks to a semester depending on the term.

Recipients who are not graduating will be encouraged to apply for our Alumni Ambassador program to continue sharing their experiences with their peers.

HACU-AIFS SCHOLARSHIPS

✓ Eligibility	Hispanic students who attend a HACU member institution
\$ Per student	up to 50% off program fee

In association with the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU), AIFS offers scholarships for Hispanic students from HACU member institutions. Students will receive a scholarship of up to 50% of the AIFS semester or summer program fee. Awards will be made in conjunction with the HACU advisory board. JOHN S. LINAKIS SCHOLARSHIP

AIFS Abroad offers a \$500 program grant to students whose immediate family members (siblings or parents) have participated in or used other AIFS programs, including ACIS, Au Pair in America and Academic Year in America.

AIFS is a Supporting Access Partner of FEA. This means that in each academic year, since 2017, AIFS contributes a specific amount of funds to support both scholarship applicants on AIFS programs, and the daily operations of the organization itself. Together we aim to increase the accessibility of AIFS Abroad study, internship, and customized faculty-led programs for underrepresented participants. We work together on marketing, outreach, and support for applicants and scholars.

To be eligible for an FEA scholarship, you must be:

- » U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- » Currently enrolled as an undergraduate at a college or university in the U.S. (graduate students are not eligible)
- » Study abroad program must be eligible for credit at the student's home institution
- » Study abroad program must be at least 4 weeks (28 days) in country/countries



GRANTS

As part of our commitment to Access, Inclusion, Diversity and Equity, AIFS Abroad has converted several scholarships into automatically awarded grants to eligible students as part of the application process; students do not need to complete a separate scholarship application. As an applicant to one of our programs, you will know before you apply which grants you are eligible/may be eligible to receive. Grants include the following:

Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs) Grant – \$500 grant for students attending a Minority Serving Institution

Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Grant – \$500 grant for students attending a Historically Black College or University

Pell Grant Eligible – \$500 grant for students who receive the Pell Grant

Gilman Recipient Grant – \$500 grant for students who receive the Gilman Award

FEA Recipient Grant – \$500 grant for students who receive a Fund for Education Abroad scholarship

Boren Recipient Grant – \$500 grant for students who receive the Boren Award

U.S. Veterans Grant – \$500 grant for students who receive GI Bill education benefits

Go Abroad Again with AIFS – \$500 grant for students who study or intern abroad again with AIFS Abroad or Global Experiences

Affiliate Grant – \$400 semester/\$200 summer or inter-term programs for students attending schools affiliated with AIFS Abroad. Visit www.aifsabroad.com/affiliates for more information or reach out to your university's study abroad office.

Students may receive multiple grants they are eligible for, up to a maximum of \$2,500 for a semester study abroad program or \$1,500 for a summer, J-term, or internship program. Grants connected with receipt of other awards and scholarships, like Pell Grant, Gilman Award, Boren Award, FEA Scholarship, and GI Bill funding will have a submission area to upload supporting documentation.

If you are traveling on a customized, faculty-led program or a group internship program, you will be eligible for the individual grants only (Pell, Gilman, FEA, Boren, Veteran, Go Abroad Again.)

CREATIVE FUNDRAISING

In addition to loans and scholarships, there are several ways for you to fund your time abroad. Below is a list of some basic activities to get started:

Letter writing campaign

- » Reach out to companies and organizations you would like to potentially work for and explain how this experience would be of benefit to them
- » Family and extended family
- » Co-workers
- » Co-workers of family members
- » Church/Religious groups
- » Social organizations (4-H, Kiwanis, Rotary, etc)
- » Greek organizations
- » Students on your campus
- » Friends at other universities

Lifestyle

- » “Keep the change” savings accounts that round up to the nearest dollar on your purchases and put funds directly into a separate savings account
- » Review and alter your daily spending habits to find ways to cut back on your discretionary spending
- » Ask friends and family to give you money or travel-related gifts for holidays and birthdays
- » Consider a part-time job

Crowdfunding

One of the most popular and creative fundraising ideas currently is crowdfunding, which is the practice of raising small money from numerous people to fund a project (in this case study or internship abroad). Previous AIFS Abroad participants have had success from this practice and raised thousands of dollars toward their program fees. Most sites charge either a per-donation or one-time fee for using their service and students should research the crowdsourcing platforms available to determine which site best suits their needs. Once you have a personalized crowdfunding website, you should share the link on social media platforms to spread the word. You can also consider getting business cards made that you can pass out to everyone. Strangers are often willing to donate to your cause if you have a compelling story and you're only asking for \$2. Every dollar counts.
