





SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANTS AND FUNDING FOR STUDY ABROAD AND GLOBAL INTERNSHIPS

Thinking about studying or interning abroad but concerned that it may be too expensive? It's more affordable than you think! By choosing the right program and using all the resources available, you can afford to study or intern abroad.







Academic Planning

Credits cost money, right? So, ensuring the credits you need to graduate on-time is essential to study abroad planning. Work with your academic advisor to map out the courses or internship experiences that best fit your degree plan to maximize the value of an experience abroad.



Semester vs. Short-Term Study Abroad

Due to its length, being abroad for a full semester seems like it is more expensive on the surface. But if you plan well, a semester abroad can replace a semester you would spend on your home campus without significant additional cost. Some students even find the daily cost of living (groceries, entertainment, public transport) is lower overseas! Financial aid and loans are more available for full semester and academic year terms, which not only covers more program cost but leaves your summers free for full-time work and savings.

If your academic major or personal obligations make going abroad for a full semester impossible, short-term study abroad like summer, January, or May-term programs are strong options. Short-term programs often offer academic focus or internship fields that directly support your major and can also be transferred toward your degree. By virtue of their abbreviated duration and fewer credits, short-term programs abroad often cost less than full semester abroad programs, but keep in mind there may be less financial aid available.







Do the Math: Home School Tuition and Fees

As you look at study abroad program options and costs, consider what you are currently paying at your home institution. If you attend a private college or are an out-of-state student at a public university, you may be paying considerably more per semester than you would pay for a semester-long study abroad program.

If you are an in-state student at a public institution, the cost of a study abroad program is comparable in many cases, after you calculate tuition and fees, housing, meals and other expenses. Take into account commuting costs and other out-of-pocket personal expenses you incur at your home institution, and that financial gap shrinks even further.



Federal Financial Aid and Loans

If you are eligible for federal financial aid and loans (Pell Grants, Stafford Loans, PLUS Loans), these funds are yours to use on a study abroad program. AIFS Abroad works with you and your home institution to facilitate their transfer and, depending on your campus, there may even be additional funding available. Perkins Loans, state grants and loans, 529 plans, and the Post 9/11 GI Bill may also be used for study abroad but require careful planning with your home institution's financial aid office early on. Home Institution or Private Source Grants and Scholarships

Scholarships and grants you receive from your home institution may be available for study abroad, too; your financial aid and study abroad offices can offer specific guidance on their transferability. And if you have grants or scholarships from outside sources like community organizations, inquire with the organization directly to ensure they can be used for study or internships abroad.



More than 50% of our program participants receive scholarships or stackable grants from AIFS Abroad. Funds are available for academic year, semester, summer and inter-term programs. The following scholarships require an application which can be completed in the student portal.

RUSSEL R. TAYLOR FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

√ Eligibility 3.5 GPA and financial need

\$ Per student 50% of program fee

The Russel R. Taylor Foundation is committed to providing study abroad scholarships for students who have demonstrated academic excellence and who have significant financial need. Scholarships covering up to half the program fee are available each semester and summer. To apply, students must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5. Students should apply by the published deadlines prior to their semester abroad, providing an essay stating their academic objectives together with supporting documentation of financial need. (Pell Grant eligible students will be given priority).

AIFS DIVERSITY ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

√ Eligibility 3.00 GPA/minority and other under-represented

students

\$ Per student \$5,000 (fall or spring semester)

AIFS Abroad offers scholarships for high achieving students from backgrounds historically underrepresented in education abroad. Each semester, we offer up to three \$5,000 scholarships to applicants who demonstrate high academic achievement and/or participate in community service activities.





AIFS ABROAD GREEN AMBASSADOR SCHOLARSHIP

√ Eligibility Applicants must demonstrate a strong commitment

to environmental sustainability.

\$ Per student \$500 per semester; \$300 for summer

AIFS Abroad is committed to sustainability, environmental responsibility, and climate action, and we are proud to offer Green Ambassador scholarships to participants who share our passion for a greener future.

Green Ambassadors will collaborate with their on-site staff to organize at least one "green" event during their program to promote sustainability and/ or climate education and awareness. Recipients will also highlight their experience on AIFS social media, through Instagram takeovers, blog posts, or other forms of content creation.

HISPANIC SERVING INSTITUTIONS SCHOLARSHIP

√ Eligibility 3.0 GPA, must attend a designated HSI \$ Per student \$3,000 semester/\$1500 summer programs

Students from Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSI) are eligible for two \$3000 semester scholarships and one \$1500 summer scholarship for use on an AIFS Abroad program. Students must meet minimum requirements and complete the scholarship application in the student portal.

HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES SCHOLARSHIP

√ Eligibility 3.0 GPA, must attend a designated HBCU \$ Per student \$3,000 semester/\$1500 summer programs

To enhance study abroad opportunities at these high-impact institutions, AIFS Abroad awards two \$3000 per semester and one \$1500 per summer term to students from designated HBCUs. Students must meet minimum requirements and complete the scholarship application in the student portal.



3.00 GPA/minority and other under-represented √ Eligibility

\$ Per student \$500 (semester or summer)

AIFS Abroad is pleased to offer five \$500 scholarships each semester and two \$500 scholarships for summer programs to outstanding students from backgrounds historically underrepresented in study abroad. Students from the following backgrounds are strongly encouraged to apply: economically disadvantaged, ethnically & racially diverse, first-generation, LGBTQIA+, students with disabilities, students of faith, veterans, and non-traditional students.

Applicants must be willing to share their experiences abroad via blogs, pictures, and/or video on social media and provide student stories at the end of their program. These materials will be shared on the AIFS Abroad social media channels and blog. Our Overseas Ambassadors serve in the role for the duration of their chosen study abroad program which can range from two weeks to a semester depending on the term.

JOHN S. LINAKIS SCHOLARSHIP

√ Eligibility AIFS Abroad student with limited financial resources who also demonstrates an interest in and commitment to social justice.

\$ Per student \$5,000 for Spring semester only

This scholarship will be awarded annually to an AIFS Abroad student with limited financial resources who also demonstrates an interest in and commitment to social justice.

STACKABLE AUTOMATIC GRANTS

AIFS Abroad is committed to Access, Inclusion, Diversity & Equity. As such, we have converted several scholarships into automatically awarded grants for eligible students as part of the application process; students do not need to complete a separate scholarship application. These grants are stackable to maximize the funding you receive. As an AIFS Abroad program applicant, you will know before you apply which grants you may be eligible to receive.

Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs) Grant – \$500 grant for students attending a Minority Serving Institution

Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Grant - \$500 grant for students attending a Historically Black College or University

Pell Grant Eligible - \$500 grant for students who receive the Pell Grant

Gilman Recipient Grant - \$500 grant for students who receive the Gilman Award

FEA Recipient Grant - \$500 grant for students who receive a Fund for **Education Abroad scholarship**

Boren Recipient Grant - \$500 grant for students who receive the Boren Award

U.S. Veterans and Dependents Grant – \$500 grant for students who receive GI Bill education benefits.

Go Abroad Again with AIFS Abroad - \$500 grant for students who study or intern abroad again with AIFS Abroad

Students may receive multiple grants for which they are eligible, up to a maximum of \$2,500 for a semester study abroad program or \$1,500 for a summer, J-term, or internship program. Grants connected with receipt of other awards and scholarships, like Pell Grant, Gilman Award, Boren Award, FEA Scholarship, and GI Bill funding will have a submission area to upload supporting documentation.

If you are traveling on a customized, faculty-led program or a group internship program, the grants are not stackable but you will remain eligible for one (Pell, Gilman, FEA, Boren, Veteran, Go Abroad Again). If you are traveling on a customized, faculty-led program or a group internship program, you will be eligible for the individual grants only (Pell, Gilman, FEA, Boren, Veteran, Go Abroad Again.)

FUND FOR FDUCATION ABROAD

AIFS is a Supporting Access Partner of the Fund for Education Abroad (FEA). Every year since 2017, AIFS has contributed funds to support both FEA scholarship applicants on AIFS Abroad programs, and the daily operations of the organization itself. Together we aim to increase the accessibility of AIFS Abroad study, internship, and faculty-led programs for underrepresented participants. We work together on marketing, outreach, and support for applicants and scholars.

To be eligible for an FEA scholarship, you must be:

- U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Currently enrolled as an undergraduate at a college or university in the U.S. (graduate students are not eligible)
- Study abroad program must be eligible for credit at the student's home institution
- Study abroad program must be at least 4 weeks (28 days) in country/ countries

"Keep the Change" Savings Apps

Several free apps round-up purchase amounts to the nearest dollar and put the difference directly into a savings account. These apps may also have options to invest that money and include sign up bonuses that add up quickly.

Crowdfunding

Past AIFS Abroad participants have raised thousands toward their program fees through small contributions on crowdfunding sites. Most sites charge a perdonation or one-time fee, so it's important to research crowdsourcing platforms to determine fit. These platforms can provide a link and QR code to share on social media, business cards, etc. Hone your elevator pitch—even strangers are often willing to donate a few dollars to a compelling story. Every dollar counts!



Gig Work

From delivering groceries to online work, there is a "gig" for everyone these days. Google is a great place to find freelance design and tech work; and we all know the trusty delivery and driving apps.

Community Outreach

It may seem old school, but community organizations are often looking for interesting causes to support. From local clubs like Kiwanis and Rotary, to national bodies like Greek fraternities and sororities, these groups often have standalone scholarship programs and those who don't are often open to donating in return for a presentation or article later on. It can help start with a letter of request, outlining what goals and objectives you have for an experience abroad and what you want to provide in return.
