Internship Abroad

International work experience can also become part of your university degree plan. You could earn college credits through your home institution or our school of record.

AIFS298: INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP

In addition to 32 to 40 hours per week working as an intern, the course



component includes journaling, graded reflection and assignments. You will gain experience in a workplace setting, translating what you learned in the classroom into practice.

HOW TO PLAN

- Check to see if an internship is a required part of your degree program or if an internship course is offered by your academic department.
- Confirm internship course requirements with your academic advisor and determine how many credits you can earn for an internship abroad.
- Work with your study abroad advisor to create an academic plan for the credits you will earn, in-person or in an online course.
- If you can't take any courses at your home institution, AIFS Abroad offers up to 12-credits through our School of Record.
- After completing your internship abroad and the necessary courses, you will be granted credit from AIFS Abroad or your home university. Your transcript will be sent to your home university after your course ends.

Designed to teach you to identify cultural differences and how to navigate a multicultural workplace, this course will increase your understanding of intercultural competence, as it applies to your host country, and about the underlying cultural concepts that can be applied to your own internship experience.
